Principal's Message

We are now in the third month of the school year. Staff and students are working hard to complete as much school work as possible. Parents Day is just a few weeks away and teachers will be working on their student report cards very soon. For the month of November there are many activities being planned such as: Fire Prevention Week, Anti -Bullying Workshops and the school's Aboriginal Veterans Day Service. The Christmas Concert theme has been decide by a vote and this year our

theme is "Candy Land". By selecting our Christmas Concert theme early, staff and students can start talking about what they would like to do for the concert and props can be made. In addition to Christmas Concert the school is planning a couple bingos to raise funds for the Three School Christmas Tree Fund. The first bingo will be held on Monday, November 21st. Our goal this year is to raise \$21,000 so we can

purchase 300 Christmas presents for students in Nursery to Grade 4 and to send 400 students in Grades 5 to 12 for a Christmas Movie and Dinner Trip. S.E.T.S Joins Partnership with the U of M And Education on Mentorship Program

The Sagkeeng School Mentorship Program now has another partner that will be helping with the schools mentorship program. Sagkeeng Employment and Training, Sagkeeng Education and the University of Manitoba -Aboriginal Youth Mentorship Program (AYMP) have created a partnership and will be signing a 3 year agreement to deliver this program from 2016 to 2019. AYMP and S.E.T.S will be cost sharing a Mentor Trainer to train high school students as mentors. The high school students will be

working with the grade 4 and 5 students throughout the school year. This program will take place after school from Monday thru Thursday. The grade 4 and 5 students will participate in physical activity games, making good choices and eating healthy. The school will provide the food for the healthy snacks and bus transportation. High school students will receive a mentorship certificate signed by the Mentorship Trainer (S.E.T.S), University of Manitoba and the Principal at the High School. The school is also working on getting this program accredited for the high school students.

Anicinabe Community School Approved for Construction.

On Wednesday, September 28, 2016 Chief Derrick Henderson received an email from the Department of Indian Affairs stating that Anicinabe Community School is approved for construction. A total of \$18,965,100 has been approved to rebuild and construct Anicinabe Community School. More information will be given out in our November newsletter.

Music Program Update

In October musician Sister Dorothy spent 4 weeks with the Grade 4 to 8 students in Norman Bruyere's Ojibwe classroom. She worked on singing in Ojibwe, playing the guitar and flute. One of the goals was to enter the CBC Music Class Competition. The song: We're Here For A Good Time: by the band Trooper was translated into "Chikamigizita" with the help of Gerry Sinclair, Norman Bruyere and Ivy Canard. A group of over 60 students practiced hard to memorize the song. This music group recorded a video with singing, guitar and flute with the help of Dan Chrusch and submitted their entry. The school will find out in December if we win the prize of music equipment for the school. The music group also went to share their songs with Katrina Rae Daycare students, the residents of the George M Care Centre and their fellow Jr. High classmates. Sister Dorothy is now working with Nursery to Grade 3 students for two weeks. She is working with Clifford Coyne in his Ojibwe class to help children learn and retain the language through interactive Ojibwe songs. They will have a final concert Friday, November 4. Upcoming in March 2017 Sister Dorothy will be back for 2 weeks with Nursery to Grade 3, and 4 Weeks in May with Grade 4-8.

Anti-Bullying Presentations

Sagkeeng Anicinabe School will be having Anti-Bullying Presentations to bring out awareness that bullying is not right or not cool. On Tuesday, November 29th students in Nursery to Grade 3 will assemble in the gym and take part in short videos and presentations on Anti-Bullying.
