Thank you for your interest in the Brandon University pilot Teacher Education Program proposed for the Winnipeg River Learning Centre, located in Pine Falls. To this end, your interest in the Program requires you to apply to Brandon University through the general registration process which is found in the site.... <https://www.brandonu.ca/>

To access the process, go to the student portal of the BU site, the future students page, and then to specific areas which might pertain to your situation. If you are a High School graduate then enter that prompt. If you are thinking about transferring from another Institution enter that site. All students regardless of Programs entered must complete the entire BU registration process online. **We request that you do so ASAP....immediate attention to the online registration process is essential. The process only takes a few minutes.** This will allow the Program time to coordinate and create course schedules for the site. The proposed program is based on a minimum of 25-30 students registered for the B.A. courses scheduled to commence in January 2017 with additional B.A. courses to the end of the Academic schedule to the end of June 2018 **These courses will serve as a foundation for the Integrated B.A./B.Ed. Teacher Education Program.** The tuition \$1,000.0000/course, which includes all textbooks and support resource material.

Additional considerations and requirements will include successful Criminal Checks and Child Abuse Registry forms to be forwarded on the Community Based Education Office. These security checks will be necessary for any Program Education courses. In addition, High School and any Post-Secondary degree Programs will need to be forwarded on to the Brandon University Registrar for processing.

We will review the pilot program viability in mid-November, and then again in mid-February, bearing in mind that for a five-year B.Ed. program starting in September 2017 to be viable, there needs to be initial enrolment of 38 students as per the budget estimate that Ken Friesen has shared with you. Also, students will need to have current criminal record checks before they begin the program.

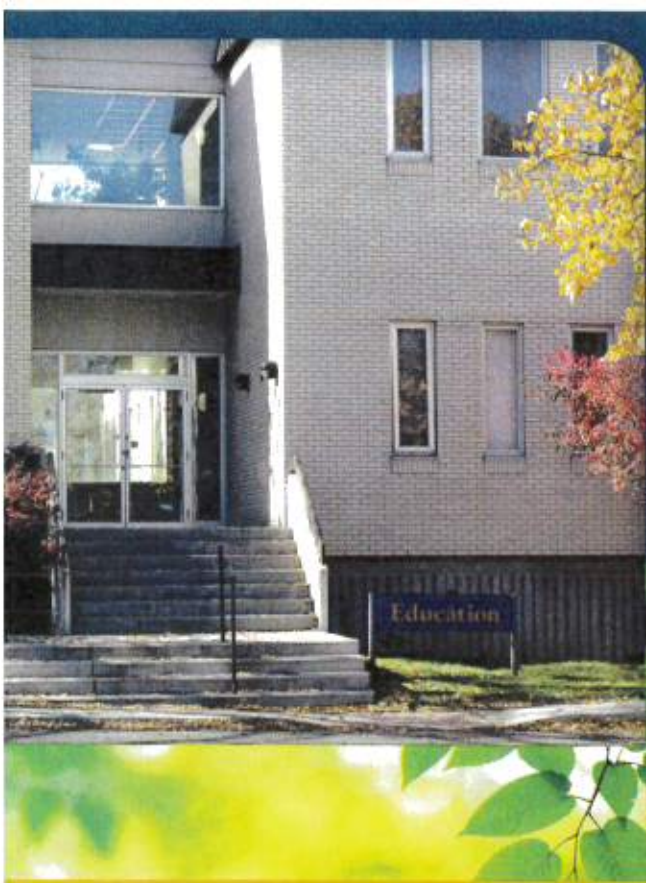
