The grades 6 to 8 Prom Night is scheduled for Thursday, June 14th and this years theme is "Hollywood". The last day of Nursery and Kindergarten classes will be on on Friday, June 8, 2018. Sagkeeng Anicinabe School in partnership with Sagkeeng Employment and Training, Chief & Council and Sagkeeng Education introduces a Pioneer Program called Sagkeeng Anicinabe School Building Project Program. This is Sagkeeng First Nations first project that involves a total of five Grade 8 students where they will construct a house with the dimensions of 28ft by 20ft from ground up! The students will be working side by side with a Carpenter (Dinelle Courchene) and the Program Coordinator (Stephen Sinclair) who will help guide the students to achieve such a big accomplishment. Through this program our primary focuses is to help the students in a number of areas primarily in- on job trade training skills, career planning, self awareness and life skills The students are currently working on the third week of what is expected to be a twelve week project. The plan is to host a raffle draw open to the community members of Sagkeeng First Nation. A total of 700 tickets will be printed and the draw will take place August 5, 2018 on the last day of Treaty Days. Tickets will be sold at \$50.00 each. Money raised will be used to sustain the project for the following year as well as giving the participants an incentive for all their hard work and dedication to making to project successful.

The house is being built on the north shore at Garry Swampy's place. We would like to thank Sagkeeng Employment and Training, Chief and Council, Sagkeeng Education and Ossis Building Supplies for their involvement in this Program. We would also like to thank the Participants Zach Smith, Addison, Dejarlais, Derek O'Laney, Antwan Guimond, Neyo Moose for all their hard work and commitment.
