School Reports – Overview:

Anicinabe / Jr. High School

Sagkeeng Anicinabe School Nursery to Grades 8 is operating as one school even though Nursery to Grade 3 is Anicinabe Community School and Sagkeeng Jr. High School is Grades 4 to 8 and has a total enrollment of 528 students. The school is now in the second year of offering full time Kindergarten and first year of offering full time Nursery. The school offers the following grades and special area classes:

For the 2018 to 2019 School year the school implemented same recess and time table times for Nursery to Grade 8. By doing this we are able to provide 17 staff on supervision for each duty and the school is able to divide the 26 classes up equally to 13 and 13 for the special area classes. The school recess times are as follows:

- ❖ 8:45 to 8:55 Students go to class
- ❖ 8:55 to 9:00 Morning announcements
- ❖ 10:30 to 10:45 First Recess

- ❖ 12:15 to 12:35 Lunch
- ❖ 12:35 to 1:00 Lunch Recess
- ❖ 2:00 to 2:15 Last Recess
- ❖ 3:15 to 3:30 Clean up and dismissal

The school offers a Nursery and Kindergarten Snack Program that is free. The school offers a Breakfast Program that is free to the students from Nursery to Grade 8. Thanks to Breakfast for Learning. In addition the school offers a Hot Lunch Program at a very minimal cost to our students and their families. The cost is:

\$3.50 per day
 \$50 per child for 20 school days
 \$80 for two children for 20 school days
 \$30 for each additional child for 20 school days

The school has a no smoking policy in effect during school hours. Staff/visitors must go off the school grounds to have a cigarette. For the past 8 years the school does not allow soda pop in the school. The school promotes just drinking water. Each class has a water cooler. Soda pop is only allowed during special days, Halloween and Valentine.

Yearly Overview of Activities:

SAGKEENG ANICINABE CHRISTMAS CONCERTS

Our school Christmas concerts were held from December 18-20, 2018. Our Nursery, Kindergarten, Grade 1 & 2 concert was on December 18, Grade 2, 3, & 4 concert was held on December 19, and our Grade 5, 6, 7, & 8 concert was held on December 20th. The theme for this year's concert was An Old Fashion Christmas. All concerts were well attended and our students performed marvelous.

SENA TRAINING

During the week of January 14-18, 2019 the teachers in Grade 1-4 were trained in the use of Schedule for Early Number Assessment – SENA. SENA is an assessment tool

that can be used in isolation by teachers to assess students' current levels of thinking in mathematics. The assessment has 2 components SENA 1 and SENA 2. The assessment provides teachers with information on students' understanding of number formation and strategies to solve problems. It is the goal of our school to increase our students' levels in Math. Training for teachers in Grade 5-8 is scheduled for September 2019.

IMPROVED MATH STRATEGIES

With the assistance of MFNERC our teachers in Grade 3-5 have recently been working on new methods and strategies to enhance math skills with our students. Math specialists are role modeling math lessons in the classroom to assist teachers in new strategies. Grade 6-8 teachers will be receiving the assistance in February.

LAND BASED EDUCATION

Our land-based education program started on January 21, 2019. Our Grades 1-8 classes will receive a full day experience in the outdoors, while our Nursery & Kindergarten students will receive ½ day of experience in the outdoors. Students are taken via snowmobile to a trap line located on the north shore bush area. Along the trail there are various camps set up and students are taught winter survival skills. Students are also exposed to the trap line and learn how the traps are set. Students also learn how to set snares. They spent the full day in the bush area and cook their lunch over an open fire.

READING ASSISTANCE GROUPS

The school has established an Early Years & Middle Years reading assistance teams. The teams work with students who are struggling with their reading. The early team works with 8 groups of students. The middle year team works with 10 groups. Students in both groups have shown improvement in their reading skills.

CARS

Our grade 3, 7, & 8 students are on involved with the Collection of Assessment Results. CARS is done on an annual basis. CARS is used to test students in numeracy and literacy. Our Grade 3 students are assessed annually in November. Our Grade 7 & 8 are tested annually in February. Assessment results are available to all parents.

Sagkeeng Anicinabe school also recognizes student have good attendance. Students that have missed two days or less are given an award.
