RE: COVID-19 CHECK POINTS SAGKEENG FIRST NATION

Sagkeeng First Nation is implementing security measures to reduce and prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus in our community. Leadership is taking measures to improve the safety of our community and our members.

Members of our communities will be allowed to enter/exit, but if they have been travelling out of the province, we ask that you declare this and to go into self-isolation in order for us to monitor. Notification will be sent to Sagkeeng Health Centre to make them aware so they can monitor your health as we do have vulnerable people in our community and we want to ensure they are safe.

The check points will limit the access of individuals entering Sagkeeng. The check points will have a crew ranging from 3 – 5 individuals that will log the names of individuals entering the community, licence plate numbers of the vehicles, and the company they represent. We will also be screening to determine their travel history internationally and provincially. We will be asking to limit their visits to the community. We are also advising all our suppliers and contractors to remain out of community if the work deemed is non-essential.

The locations of the check points are:

PTH #11 – west side entrance to Sagkeeng by Catfish Creek
PTH #11 – east side entrance to Sagkeeng from Pine Falls
North Shore Road – entrance to Sagkeeng First Nation
