CODE LEVEL ORANGE

SFN would consider applying this alert if:

- Community transmission of COVID-19 is at medium level.
- New clusters are occurring, but can be controlled through self-isolation, testing and contact tracing so they do not spread further.
- The health care system is able to manage COVID-19 case levels.

Detailed Description of Levels:

The following may be considered if this alert level is applied:

- Gatherings limited to 5 people.
- Only 262 members and long-term residents (i.e. spouses) are allowed in SFN.
- Added restrictions to George M. Guimond Personal Care Home, if necessary
- Katrina Rae Daycare is to be closed.
- K-12 Schools are to remain at level 3, closed with remote learning.
- SFN offices are to close and staff are to work from home.
- Essential services will remain open with restrictions and reduced hours of operation.
- Private businesses that are essential are to remain open, but with reduced hours and with continued restrictions in place.
- Funerals are restricted to immediate family members only, with no wake services (Parents, siblings and grandparents). Public health order to be followed. Masks mandatory.
- VLT's remain open with reduced hours (**close at 10 pm**) for SFN residents and spouses.
- Masks and hand washing/sanitizing are mandatory.
- Social distancing at 2 meters at all times.
- Children 12 and under are not permitted to enter any public establishments (i.e. funerals, stores, etc.).
- Community curfew to remain from 12 am to 6 am, failure to comply with the curfew may result in a fine.
- SFN Checkpoints will remain in place with minimal contact tracing questions.

ORDER OF SAGKEENG ANICINABE GOVERNMENT

WHEREAS the Chief and Council of the Sagkeeng First Nation are empowered by the people to act on behalf of the First Nation and are recognized as having such authority by the Government of Canada; and,

WHEREAS the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS-CoV-2) and has resulted in a global pandemic; and,

WHEREAS the growing number of COVID-19 cases in the province of Manitoba is of great concern to the Chief and Council for the Sagkeeng community members; and,

WHEREAS the Chief and Council of the Sagkeeng First Nation have decided at a duly convened meeting October 26, 2020, that they will implement a COVID Alert Levels act for the Sagkeeng First Nation; and,


THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Chief and Council of the Sagkeeng First Nation has declared that the community is in code level ORANGE.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Chief and Council of Sagkeeng First Nation have ordered a 14-day closure effective immediately for the community and its members, as a precautionary measure to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19.


THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Chief and Council of Sagkeeng First Nation will re-evaluate the Community Closure **November 9, 2020**.


